Dear John...



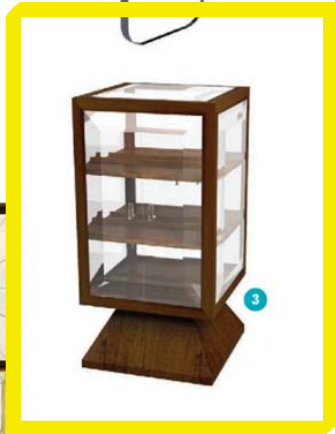
John Bossone spent 25 years helping architects and interior designers around the globe refine their ideas for lavish furniture designs and turn them into something tangible. On his own list of accomplishments: the renovation of the historic Tweed Court House in New York and the MGM Grand Hotel & Casino in Macau. He's also the creative genius behind the chic, modern furniture designs from **Jonathan Franc** (23811 Aliso Creek Road, Laguna Niguel, 949.305.4445, jonathanfranc.com) and its **Design Gives Back** collection, a collaboration of 11 top designers whose special-edition furnishings benefit a variety of worthy charities. What's the inspiration behind your Lotus table design? The lotus flower is regarded as a symbol of self-regeneration and rebirth—a perfect metaphor for the human condition. It can grow in the most difficult of environments, with its roots dangling in the most challenging water sources, yet it is capable of producing one of the world's most beautiful flowers.
Tell us about the charity you chose to support. The MS Society—my family's been personally touched by multiple sclerosis. I've seen how it changes the lives of all the people it touches. There must be further funding to help researchers find the cause and, finally, a cure. **Give me a gauge of the program's success.** We were very excited to have Martyn Lawrence-Bullard's Zebra chair auctioned off at Elton John's AIDS Foundation in New York. **Any chance you'll be extending the program beyond Dec. 31?** We haven't decided, but everyone at Jonathan Franc enjoys being involved with charitable organizations, and we have many more ideas.
